Goal: Reduce chronic offending amongst a targeted offender population

Theory

A relatively small number of offenders account for a relatively large proportion of offenses in a given neighborhood. IF researchers and practitioners conduct analyses to assess the nature of the crime problems and identify the offenders involved and IF general and specific deterrence messages,

targeted law enforcement and social service responses are developed and delivered to a targeted group of offenders, THEN these offenders will be less likely to continue to engage in the targeted criminal behavior.
